Select at least three activities to complete a week, colour each activity when completed. Can you get a completed row?

You can earn house points for each completed row or column. *Parents - You can put as much detail into each task as is appropriate for your child.*

<p><b>Spelling</b> Write out the tricky words you have been learning. Write in uppercase the first time and lower case the second time.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some words for items in the house, such as hat, toy, chair, bed, sink. Go on a hunt around the house and tick off all the objects on the checklist that you find.</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Ask a grown up to write a simple sentence for you to read, such as 'The hen is in the box.' Can you read the sentence and then draw a picture to match the sentence?</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Do a good deed for someone at home without needing to be asked, e.g help Mum bring in the washing, set the table, etc.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Count the number of teaspoons you have in the kitchen. How many would there be if there were 5 less?</p>
<p><b>Practical</b> Go for a nature walk around your home and write down the names of objects you see for each letter of the alphabet. i.e. a-apple tree, b-bark, etc.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Make a collection of objects from around your house. Can you write labels for each object on small pieces of paper using the correct spelling?</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> How many doors are in your house? How many would there be if there were 4 more?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Read a book with a grown-up and decide which character was your favourite. Talk about what they were like and why they were your favourite then write a sentence about them.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to hide some objects in boxes. The objects must be words that can be decoded, for example a block, pen, leaf, car, train. On each box, write a label of what is inside. Read the words on the box and check inside to see if you were right.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b> There are 10 people on a bus. Then, 2 more people get on. How many people are on the bus altogether? Try drawing a picture to help you work out the answer.</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Spread out big pieces of paper with words written on them on the floor. Your grown-up can say a word and you can jump on the one with the correct word.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Practise tying your shoelaces.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Play a game of phonics musical statues. Ask a grown-up to write some decodable words on pieces of paper. Put some music on and have a dance around. Once the music stops, run to one of the words and sound it out.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Write some of the tricky words in the air with your finger. Ask someone to read your words as you write.</p>
<p><b>Reading</b> Use chalk to draw three circles on the ground outside. Ask a grown-up to write a letter into each circle to make a word. Can you say each letter sound as you jump into the circles? What word did you sound out?</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Make shadow shapes on a wall, ask an adult to take some photos.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Draw a big flower. Write 5 of your tricky words on each petal.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Jack's beanstalk is 12cm tall. It grows 2cm taller. How tall is Jack's beanstalk?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonic skills to help your grown-up write a shopping list.</p>
<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonics skills to make a poster to display in a window. It could show who you want to say thank you to or it could be a special message you would like to share.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Ask an adult to hide the numbers to 20 around your home. Can you find them all and put them into the correct order? You could ask someone to tell you a number to find.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words on pieces of paper and hide them around the room. Have a tricky word hunt to find and read the words.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Choose 8 words from your reading book and play, <u>Look, cover, say, write, check.</u></p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Fill up an empty washing up liquid bottle with water and write words on the ground.</p>

<p><b>Spelling</b> Make a collection of objects from around your house. Can you write labels for each object on small pieces of paper using the initial sounds?</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Play a word hunt game using one of your favourite books. Can you find the words: he, she, they, go, said.</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Write tricky words onto empty plastic bottles to create skittles. Ask a grown-up to call out a tricky word and try to knock down the correct bottle with a large ball.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Do a good deed for someone at home without needing to be asked, e.g help Mum bring in the washing, set the table, etc.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Count the number of teaspoons you have in the kitchen. How many would there be if there were 2 less?</p>
<p><b>Practical</b> Go for a nature walk around your home and write down the names of objects you see for each letter of the alphabet. i.e. a-apple tree, b-bark, etc.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Ask a grown-up to write some words but with the letters in the wrong order. Can you write the words with the correct spelling?</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> How many doors are in your house? How many would there be if there were 2 more?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Write a simple sentence for you to read, such as 'The hen is red.' Draw a picture to match the sentence?</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words in chalk outside. When they say a word, can you find it and squirt it with your water shooter or throw a ball at it?</p>
<p><b>Maths</b> There are 7 people on a bus. Then, 3 more people get on. How many people are on the bus altogether? Try drawing a picture to help you work out the answer.</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Spread out big pieces of paper with letters written on them on the floor. Your grown-up can say a simple word and you can jump on and say the letters that make that word.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Practise doing up your buttons.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words onto white paper using a white wax crayon or (unlit) candle. Paint over the top using watered down paint. What words can you find?</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Choose 6 words from your reading book and play, <u>Look, cover, say, write, check.</u></p>
<p><b>Reading</b> Can you draw a picture to go with these sentences? The rat is in the tub. The cat has a long tail. The glass is full of milk.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Make shadow shapes on a wall, ask an adult to take some photos.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Choose 5 words from your reading book and play, <u>Look, cover, say, write, check.</u></p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Jack's beanstalk is 8cm tall. It grows 2cm taller. How tall is Jack's beanstalk?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonics skills to make a poster to display in your bedroom window.</p>
<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonic skills to help your grown-up write a birthday party list.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Ask an adult to hide the numbers to 20 around your home. Can you find them all and put them into the correct order?</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to hide a teddy or other toy around the house. Get them to write some simple clues such as 'on the chair', 'in the box' or 'under the bed'. Follow the hunt to see if you can find the teddy.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Draw a big flower. Write 4 of your spelling words on each petal.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Fill up an empty washing up liquid bottle with water and write words on the ground.</p>

<p><b>Spelling</b> Draw a big flower. Write 3 of your tricky words on each petal.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some tricky words onto white paper using a white wax crayon or (unlit) candle. Paint over the top using watered down paint. What words can you find?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Draw a picture of a story you have read and enjoyed. Can you tell your grown up about the picture you have drawn?</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Do a good deed for someone at home without needing to be asked, e.g help Mum bring in the washing, set the table, etc.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Count the number of teaspoons you have in the kitchen. How many would there be if there were 1 less?</p>
<p><b>Practical</b> Go for a 'colour; walk around your home and with an adult to help you write down the names of the different colours you can see.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Use the words, dog cat hat top tap and play, <u>Look, cover, say, write, check.</u></p>	<p><b>Maths</b> How many doors are in your house? How many would there be if there were 1 more?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonic skills to help your grown-up write a list of your choice.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write a secret sentence and cut it up into words. Ask them to mix up the order of the words. See if you can read the words and put them into the correct order to make the sentence.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b> There are 4 people on a bus. Then, 2 more people get on. How many people are on the bus altogether? Try drawing a picture to help you work out the answer.</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Write some letters on small pieces of paper or sticky notes. Can you build words with the letters?</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Practise putting your jumper on and off.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to write some letters onto white paper using a white wax crayon or (unlit) candle. Paint over the top using watered down paint. What letters can you find?</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Practise writing both your names.</p>
<p><b>Reading</b> Ask a grown-up to draw a O &amp; X grid on a piece of paper and to write a word in each square. Take it in turns to read the word before you mark your X or O.</p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Make shadow shapes on a wall, ask an adult to take some photos.</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Tell an adult a silly sentence using some chosen words from your reading book.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Jack's beanstalk is 5cm tall. It grows 3cm taller. How tall is Jack's beanstalk?</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Spread a layer of sand or flour into the base of a tray. Ask a grown up to say a word, then use your finger or a paintbrush to write the word into the sand.</p>
<p><b>Writing</b> Use your phonics skills to make a poster to display in your bedroom window. What will your poster be about?</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> When you open a packet of raisins/carrots or apple pieces. Count how many you have? Can you write the number down?</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Choose a picture book that you enjoy or that looks interesting. Use the words you recognise and the pictures. Can you read somebody a bedtime story?</p>	<p><b>Spelling</b> Choose 3 words from your reading book and play, <u>Look, cover, say, write, check</u></p>	<p><b>Practical</b> Fill up an empty washing up liquid bottle with water and write your name on the ground.</p>
